Both state nursing home associations; Leading Age NE and the Nebraska Health Care Association, have entered into a public awareness campaign to educate the citizens of Nebraska about the deplorable financing of long-term care for our Ro

The methodology was to take the cost of running the nursing home from two years ago and give the facility a 2-3% increase for inflation! Food costs, utilities, labor, etc.....when was the last time inflation went up by only 2% every two years?????

medicaid residents.

This was bad enough, but because of the reduction in tax receipts, the current reimbursement for nursing homes is 2.65% LESS than the cost of two years ago. What business can survive with this situation? The cost of providing care to the residents has outpaced their ability to pay for themselves. So the government, state and federal, pay for nursing home care through medicaid. Many of our rural facilities have about 65% of their residents on medicaid.

Many rural facilities have closed over the last three years. This trend will continue without a concerted effort by our state senators to address this crisis.




St. Joseph's Villa David City, NE




